

Thomas Satterwhite, MD, is a board-certified plastic and reconstructive surgeon and Adjunct Clinical Assistant Professor in the Division of Plastic Surgery at Stanford University School of Medicine. He earned his undergraduate degree in Human Biology with Honors from Stanford University, where he was elected to Phi Beta Kappa. He subsequently received his medical degree from Stanford University and completed his residency in plastic and reconstructive surgery at Stanford Hospital. He then pursued a craniofacial fellowship in Miami under the mentorship of S. Anthony Wolfe, MD.

Dr. Satterwhite is nationally and internationally recognized for his work in reconstructive and gender-affirming surgery. He has delivered more than 100 podium presentations at major scientific meetings and has authored over 60 peer-reviewed publications and book chapters. His research focuses on surgical outcomes, patient-reported outcome measures, complication management and the development of evidence-based standards in gender-affirming care. His work has contributed to multi-institutional collaborations and consensus efforts advancing surgical standards in this evolving field.

He serves on the Editorial Board of *Plastic and Reconstructive Surgery* and has been recognized as a Top 100 Reviewer for the journal. Dr. Satterwhite holds leadership roles within the American Society of Plastic Surgeons, including service on the Educational Program Committee and the inaugural PRIDE Steering Committee, and has completed the ASPS Essentials of Leadership program. He also serves on the Inclusion and Diversity Committee of The Aesthetic Society and has held senior scientific leadership roles within the World Professional Association for Transgender Health (WPATH) and the United States Professional Association for Transgender Health (USPATH), including Scientific Committee Co-Chair.

At Stanford, Dr. Satterwhite serves as Co-Director of the gender-affirming surgery rotation for senior plastic surgery residents and is deeply committed to surgical education and mentorship.

He is the founder and CEO of Align Surgical Associates, a six-surgeon multispecialty private practice with locations in San Francisco and Los Angeles, where he provides comprehensive reconstructive and gender-affirming surgical care.
