

## **Sonu A. Jain MD – PSF Visiting Professor**

I am an Associate Professor of Plastic Surgery and Orthopaedics at Ohio State University. I serve as the Chief of Hand Surgery in the Department of Plastic and Reconstructive Surgery and the Associate Program Director for the Hand and Upper Extremity Fellowship with Orthopaedic Surgery. I am privileged to work with residents in both plastic surgery and orthopaedics, hand fellows from both plastic and orthopaedic backgrounds and medical students.

I went to medical school in Philadelphia at MCP Hahnemann School of Medicine. I actually completed a residency in Otolaryngology-Head and Neck Surgery at Louisiana State University in New Orleans prior to my residency in Plastic Surgery at the Lahey Clinic in Boston. I stayed in Boston for my Orthopaedic Hand Fellowship at the Massachusetts General Hospital/Harvard Medical School.

Hand surgery, in my opinion, is the greatest. As a hand surgeon you are the best of Plastic Surgery, Orthopaedic Surgery, Neurological Surgery and Vascular Surgery for that patient's upper limb.
