

Dr. Amber Leis is the Residency Program Director and the Division Chief for Plastic Hand surgery at the Department of Plastic Surgery at University of California, Irvine. She is a hand and microsurgeon with a special focus on pediatric and congenital hand, brachial plexus birth injury, adult traumatic brachial plexus injury and peripheral nerve injury. She is the founder of the brachial plexus birth injury program at CHOC Children's Hospital. Dr. Leis was raised by two artists in rural Oregon. She received her MD at Johns Hopkins School of Medicine and then completed an integrated plastic surgery residency at Loma Linda University.
