CAPT Eamon B. O'Reilly, MD Medical Corps US Navy Bio Statement

CAPT Eamon O'Reilly was in raised in Anchorage, Alaska and while not a true "Sourdough" (native) of Alaska, he grew up in the Chugach State Forest and eventually matriculated to the University of Notre Dame in South Bend Indiana graduating in 2000 with a degree in Biochemistry. While on an US Navy Health Professions scholarship, he received his medical degree from the University of Washington in 2004 where he was part of the WWAMI Alaska program. Dr. O'Reilly completed his General Surgery internship and residency training at the Naval Medical Center San Diego (NMCSD) from 2004- 2009. He then completed three years of Plastic Surgery training in 2013 at Parkland Hospital in the University of Texas Southwestern Plastic Surgery Residency program in Dallas, Texas. While at UTSW, he served as the academic Chief Resident from 2012-2013. He serves on numerous national level boards and committees.

Since 2013 Dr. O'Reilly has served at Naval Medical Center San Diego in the Department of Plastic Surgery and is a double Board Certified staff surgeon in General and Plastic Surgery. He served as both the Department Head and Plastic Surgery Consultant to the US Navy Surgeon General from 2017 until 2021. His clinical interests include complex microsurgery reconstruction of the breasts, upper and lower extremities, genitourinary, and of the head and neck. Since 2017 Dr. O'Reilly has provided genderaffirming surgery as part of a robust Multidisciplinary team, to include top surgery, bottom surgery, and facial feminization. He has active and ongoing research in the topic, and fully supports the transgender community. Since 2020 he has supported complete virtual planning Jaw-in-a-Day surgery and platform development at NMCSD to include immediate dental rehabilitation with 3D printed teeth, a first in the Department of Defense and on the West Coast.

While serving in the US Navy as a Plastic Surgeon Dr. O'Reilly has been deployed overseas on the hospital ship USNS Mercy to South East Asia to include Vietnam, Philippines, Fiji, Malaysia, and Papua New Guinea among others. He has served cross service with the US Air Force operating in England, and most recently served 9 months in Afghanistan at the NATO Role 3 Hospital in Kandahar. While not deployed, he actively participates in academic partnership with the University of California San Diego, and enjoys cycling a few hundred hours a year. He is married with two children, two large dogs, and two small cats.
